NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING No. 2

Highland County intends to apply to Ohio Department of Development for funding under the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Small Cities Program, a federally funded program administered by the state. The county is eligible for \$182,000 of FY-2011 CDBG funding, provided the county meets applicable program requirements. On May 11, 2011, the county held its first public hearing to inform citizens of the CDBG program, how it may be used, what activities are eligible and other program requirements.

Based on both citizens' input and local officials' assessment of county needs, the county is proposing to undertake the following CDBG activities for Fiscal Year 2011 (to be completed in 2012):

1. City of Hillsboro will resurface 644 lf of Pleasant Street. The total CDBG funds available are \$28,900.00.
2. Village of Greenfield will resurface 541 lf of McClain Avenue. The total CDBG funds available are \$35,000.00.
3. Paint Township will resurface 2,323 lf of Lochness Drive. The total CDBG funds available are \$40,000.00.
4. Village of Mowrystown will repair/install approximately 2,500 lf of sidewalk in various locations in the village. The total CDBG funds available are \$27,928.00.
5. Village of Lynchburg will resurface 595 lf of Appleway Street. The total CDBG funds available are \$13,772.00.

For all projects, the National Objective to meet is benefit to low and moderate income persons.

A second public hearing will be held on July 20 at 10:00 a.m. local time in the County Commissioners' meeting room, 119 Governor Foraker Place Hillsboro, Ohio. This is to give citizens an adequate opportunity to review and comment on the county's proposed CDBG application, including the proposed activities summarized above, before the county submits its applications to the Ohio Department of Development. Citizens are encouraged to attend this meeting to express their views and comments on the county's proposed CDBG application.
